During the past 20 years the Utah Office of Crime Victim Reparations has reached out to thousands of victims who have suffered financial loss, physical injuries and emotional trauma as a result of violent crime. The assistance provided by this program helps victims recover and rebuild their lives. Approximately \$154.5 million dollars have been awarded through compensation and victim assistance since the program's inception. No tax dollars are used to fund the compensation and victim assistance programs. These programs are funded through state and federal surcharges on fines, penalties and forfeitures.


Crime Victim Compensation Program

Purpose: To compensate victims of violent crime who have suffered physical and psychological injury as well as families and dependents of deceased victims.

Source of Funding: Surcharge on fines.

Range of Awards: Awards can be made up to a maximum of \$25,000. However, reparations may be awarded up to \$50,000 for expenses incurred as a result of homicide, attempted homicide, aggravated assault, or DUI offenses.


Victim Claim Activity

FY 2006 VICTIM ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Victim of Crime Act Assistance Grants

Purpose: VOCA grants provide funding that enables the state, local governments and private nonprofit organizations to enhance and expand services to crime victims, promoting development of comprehensive services to crime victims throughout the state.

Source of Funding: Surcharge on Federal Fines.

Range of Awards: \$9,169 to \$109,204

Statistics: 67 VOCA funded programs across the state provided services to a total of 66,303 crime victims. Of that number 43,111 were primary victims who were harmed by a chargeable crime and 23,192 were secondary victims such as the spouse, children, parents or siblings of the primary victim.

STOP Violence Against Women Act Grants


Purpose: VAWA grants encourage the development and implementation of effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to combat violent crimes against women and the development and enhancement of victim services in cases involving crimes against women.

Source of Funding: Federal Funds

Range of Awards: \$5,343 to \$79,691

Statistics: There are 45 VAWA funded agencies across the state.
